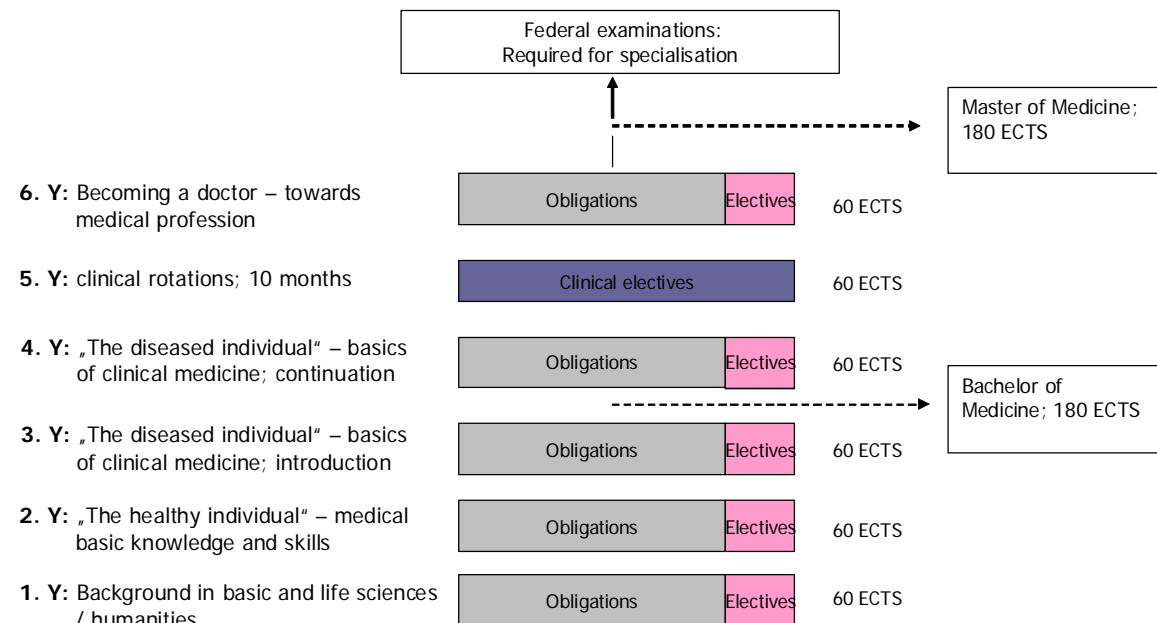

Study Programme

Exchange within the Swiss European Mobility Programme is possible for advanced students in medicine (equivalent to Master cycle). They can participate in courses of the study-years 3rd Bachelor (3. Year), 1st Master (4. Year). **Combinations** of the 3 year and the 1st Master are possible **only to a very limited** extent, due to conflicting time schedules. 2nd Year Master (5. Year) is the year of clinical electives, which are not organized centrally by the office of medical education.

Clinical clerkships (subinternships) are not the regular part of the Swiss European Mobility Programme at the home University. They are only possible in exceptional cases, when they are an obligatory part of the study programme. A clinical clerkship in Zurich usually lasts at least one full month (from the first until the last working day) it requires about 40 - 50 hours of presence per week at the hospital ward. 6 ECTS credit points are allocated for 1 month of clinical rotation.

Exams

Written exams take place at the end of each semester. For the students of the University of Zurich the passing of these exams is a prerequisite for the allocation of the credit points for the thematic block courses. Our written exams integrate clinical knowledge from different subjects (e.g. internal medicine, pathology, paediatrics' etc.) and are not discipline centred. Therefore, an examination in one single subject requires a special procedure.

We recommend a minimum level of B2, as defined by the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), in the language of instruction.</p> <p>It is the responsibility of the partner universities to nominate students that have adequate language skills. However, we reserve the right to reject students if we perceive that they will not be able to successfully follow courses and exams.</p> <p>Students who intend to take courses in German or English Literature and Linguistics, and who are non-native speakers of the respective language, are expected to have a standard of proficiency at the level of C1 of the CEFR in the respective language.</p> <p>In philology courses the language of instruction is often the language of the region studied.</p> <p>The course catalogue provides more information on the language of instruction: www.courses.uzh.ch</p>
