


<b>Nomination requirements</b>	<p>Partner universities must select and officially nominate students for academic exchange <b>who have passed all first-year subjects</b> and who are able and willing to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>— Abide by UIC Barcelona's academic calendar, rules &amp; regulations</li> <li>— Comply with applicable visa/immigration policies &amp; local laws</li> <li>— Ensure complete medical coverage for their entire stay at UIC Barcelona</li> <li>— Have a sufficient level of the teaching language of the courses they have chosen</li> <li>— Health Sciences students should provide immunisation records</li> </ul> <p>Visiting/free-mover students don't have to be nominated, but should fulfill the requirements mentioned above.</p>

<b>Language requirements</b>	<p><b>B2 in Spanish and/or English.</b></p> <p>The student needs to provide a certificate for the language/s they are going to study in. Some health sciences degrees accept a B1. Please see the faculty-specific fact sheet. Native speakers do not need to provide a certificate.</p> <p>The OLS language test is not accepted as proof of students' language level.</p>	
<b>Acceptance Letter</b>	<p>Students will receive an acceptance letter once they have completed their Relint profile and sent in the required documents. <b>The letter will be sent by email</b>, and the original can be sent to the student's university by post when requested.</p> <p>This letter is generated especially for students needing to apply for a student visa or accommodation. <b>It does not guarantee the final acceptance of the student's study plan / Learning Agreement.</b></p>

<p><b>Available courses for exchange students</b></p>	<p>Information on courses can be found in faculty-specific fact sheets (sent to students by email after the nomination).</p> <p>We will inform students about course timetables and the academic calendar during June-July.</p>	
<p><b>Teaching language of individual subjects</b></p>	<p>Courses in Spanish and English, with some courses in Catalan. Please check the fact sheet / faculty guide the students will receive upon nomination.</p> <p>The sending institution, following the agreement with our institution, is responsible for providing support to its nominated candidates so that they can have the recommended language skills at the start of the study or teaching period.</p>	
<p><b>Academic coordinators</b></p>	<p>The main contact for the Learning Agreement is the academic coordinator (contacts in faculty fact sheets).</p>	
<p><b>How to create the Learning Agreement</b></p>	<p><b>Students have to</b> create their Learning Agreements online, in UIC Barcelona’s internal Department of International Relations platform, and through Erasmus Without Paper. More information provided in the application guide.</p>

<p><b>Language courses</b></p>	<p>Will be determined in the beginning of each semester. Approx. 2 weeks after the classes start.</p> <p>Our Department for Applied Linguistics offers Catalan, Spanish, English and French lessons through on-site, blended or online courses. These courses carry an enrolment fee for all students. Students in the Erasmus+ programme have access to reduced rates. The department also offers a wide selection of other languages through the Rosetta Stone platform. Study regulations	On attendance	<b>Attendance to on-campus classes is obligatory.</b> Students must present a justification in case of absence. Too many absences may result in failing the course.
	On exams	<b>Examination dates cannot be changed</b> unless a justification is presented to the faculty in advance. In some faculties, it may be possible to advance the semester 1 exam dates upon request.
	On extending stay	<b>Students may extend their stay</b> by making a formal request in advance to International Relations who will pass it on to the faculty in question for assessment. Students should take into account the possible <b>visa extension process and requirements.</b>
	Students should always check the faculty-specific fact sheet for more information and details.	
Transcript of records	<p>A transcript of records will be issued in February for semester 1 students and in late July for annual / semester 2 students. The exact dates may vary. We will send a signed PDF <b>by email</b> to the students and universities, and the original by post to the home university only when requested.</p> <p>Certificates for language courses at the Department for Applied Linguistics are sent separately.</p>

<b>Pre-arrival webinar</b>	<p>After the nomination deadline, we organise a pre-arrival webinar each semester for all nominated students to help them with all the documents required for the application to UIC Barcelona and provide them with practical information for their mobility.</p> <p>Students will receive an invitation by email after nomination.</p>	
<b>Welcome activities</b>	<p>Each semester we organise a Welcome Session for new exchange students. Attendance is obligatory. Additionally we organise cultural activities for students to meet each other and get to know Barcelona.</p>	
<b>Buddy Program</b>	<p>Students can request a local buddy (UIC Barcelona student) who will accompany them during their first weeks at UIC Barcelona.</p>	
<b>Visa</b>	<p>UIC Barcelona can provide assistance for securing visas for incoming and outgoing students/staff if necessary.</p>
